## **2. Generic Elective (interdisciplinary)**

There are 8 papers college may offer any two papers in each semester (from Sem- I to IV) and students should opt only one paper each semester.

## **3. Ability Enhancement (AE Skill Based):**

*For BA (Hons.)*

Any Two papers can be offered in both Semesters III and IV to Political Science Hons students. Students may opt any one paper in each semester.

1. **Your Laws, Your Rights**
2. **Public Opinion and Survey Research**
3. **Legislative Practices and Procedures**
4. **Peace and Conflict Resolution**

*For BA (Prog.)*

Ability Enhancement (Elective) Skill Based Course (Semester III and IV as per the new Syllabus and Semester V and VI as per the old syllabus) papers should be offered as per the following:

1. **Semester III: Legislative Support**
2. **Semester IV: Public Opinion and Survey Research**
