## **Notice for Filling Forms for Elective Courses for MA Sem-III Students**

- 1. The Elective Courses form will be accepted only with effect from 8 September 2022 (Thursday), 11:00 AM onwards. You cannot fill the form before this time and date.
- 2. Elective Courses form submission for session 2022-23 (MA Final Semester III) will be done via online medium using **Google Forms ONLY**. The <u>link</u> will be available on the Department Website and will be active at **11:00 AM on 08 September 2022 (Thursday).**
- 3. The link will be active **till 2:00 PM, 9 September 2022** (Friday).
- 4. Only ONE response per e-mail ID would be registered.
- 5. Students need to have a **GMAIL ACCOUNT**. Those students, who do not have a Gmail account, are required to register for a Gmail account and use the same for filling up the form.
- 6. It is mandatory to fill up all the details in the form. Incomplete forms will not be submitted.
- 7. Students are required to select **four** elective courses. Selections will be accepted according to first-come-first-serve basis.
- 8. There is a limit of **200** students for each elective course. Therefore, the first 200 students opting for a particular elective course, on a first come first serve basis, shall be entertained. Once an elective course has received 200 applicants, it shall no longer be available.
- 9. The cap of 200 is not applicable for students with disabilities and foreign students. They need to contact the Department Office to submit their request, if the elective course is not available through the Google Form.
- 10. Students will be given once chance to change their selected electives subject to availability of seats, date for which shall be announced later.
- 11. A **sample form** is available on the Department website.
- 12. Students enrolled in SOL & NCWEB need to approach their respective concerned offices for choosing optional papers. They do not need to fill this online form.

- c) The link will be available on the Department website. However, it will not be active before 8 September 2022, Thursday, 11:00 AM.
