

Notice for Filling Forms for Elective Courses for MA Sem-III Students

Date: 01.08.2024

1. The Elective Courses form will be accepted with effect from 08 August 2024 (Thursday), 11:00 AM onwards. You cannot fill the form before this time and date.
2. Elective Courses form submission for session 2024-25 (MA Final Semester III) will be done via online medium using **Google Forms ONLY**. The [link](#) will be available on the Department Website and will be active at **11:00 AM on 08 August 2024 (Thursday)**. **Link:** https://docs.google.com/forms/d/e/1FAIpQLSdteJi_lntWIWomdYZFd3AncuS0pFszZHZN8_OJZsTIIzkw/viewform?usp=sf_link
3. The link will be active till 11:59 PM on 09 August 2024 (Friday).
4. Only ONE response per e-mail ID would be registered.
5. Students need to have a **GMAIL ACCOUNT**. Those students, who do not have a Gmail account, are required to register for a Gmail account and use the same for filling up the form.
6. It is mandatory to fill up all the details in the form. Incomplete forms will not be submitted.
7. Students are required to select **four** elective courses. Selections will be accepted according to first-come-first-serve basis.
8. There is a **limit of 200 students for each elective course**. Therefore, only the first 200 students opting for a particular elective course, on a first-come-first-serve basis, shall be entertained. Once an elective course has received 200 applicants, it shall no longer be available.
9. The cap of 200 is not applicable for students with disabilities and foreign students. They need to contact the Department Office to submit their request, if the elective course of choice is not available through the Google Form.
10. Students will be given once chance to change their selected electives subject to availability of seats, date for which shall be announced later.
11. A [sample form](#) is available on the Department website.
12. Students enrolled in SOL & NCWEB need to approach their respective concerned offices for choosing optional papers. They do not need to fill this online form.

Following are the instructions to fill the form online:

- a) The link will open a Google Form where the student has to fill the following details:
 1. E-mail ID
 2. Name
 3. 10-Digit Mobile Number
 4. PG College Name (to be selected from the drop-down menu)
 5. Examination Roll No.
 6. Preference of Electives from four different slots (from four drop-down menus)
- b) Students need to make sure that they have these details ready before opening the form.
- c) Students are advised to keep fifth/sixth choice of elective course in mind in case their primary choices are no longer available from the drop-down menu.
- d) The link will be available on the Department website. However, it will not be active before **Thursday, 08 August 2024, 11:00 AM**. Further details and updates will be posted here: <http://www.polscience.du.ac.in/Registration-for-Elective-Courses-Sem-III>
